- Black Hawk County population = 132,904




Floodplain Characteristics

- Cedar River
- 4,100 acres in the SFHA
- A and AE zones
- Top 5 River Levels
 - 2008 102.13
 - 2016 98.9
 - 1999 96.2
 - 1961 96.1
 - 1993 95.8
- Top of the Levee 102.9




Cedar Falls Flood Buyout Program

- 1993 = 100 properties
- 1999 = 65 properties
- 2008 = 171 properties
- Residential = 318
- Vacant Lots = 5
- Commercial = 11
- Mobile Home Parks = 2
- Total = 336




Pre-Flood Preparations

- PSAs
- Set up Emergency Operations Center (EOC)
- Departmental assignments
- Fire Department Distributes Flood Information
 - Door to door

29 30 31

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95.9 water	covers E. Lone	Tree Rd., 200-3	00 blocks covered
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- 95.9 water covers south end of Timothy St.
- 96.0 water covers 1500–1700 blocks of Center St. between the Brown Bottle & Cottage Row Rd.
- 97.8 water covers the 200 block of E. Lone Tree Rd.

- Donation drop off sites
 - Food, clothing, cleaning supplies, pet food
 - Red Cross partner

- Flood status
- Staff EOC 24/7
- Sandbagging
- Bladder system





Flood Event

- Citizen flood status
- Staff EOC 24/7
- HESCO barrier units
- Bladders







Post-Flood Activities

- Property Inspections
 - Distribute post flood information

- Damage assessments
- Continue EOC Operations







Ordinance Development Flood of 2008 Warranted Changes

Major changes include


- Lowest floor
 - 500 year flood elevation +1 foot
- Limit fill activity in SFHA
 - 3 foot maximum fill height
 - 1/3 of the lot area
 - No LOMRs
- Limit platting of lot in SFHA




Map Updates

Flood Rate Insurance Map

- New FIRM maps adopted in July of 2011
- Worked with FEMA to complete the analysis of unstudied areas of the SFHA

- Permeable pavers
- Stormwater control

- Cedar Falls CRS Community May 2014
- Class 5
- Up to a 25% discounts on flood insurance



Community Rating System


- Awarded points on certain activities •
 - Maintaining flood maps, permits, elevation certificates •
 - Public outreach ullet
 - Open space preservation (buyouts)
 - Higher standards
 - **Repetitive Loss Properties**
 - Stormwater management
 - Floodplain management planning (Hazard Mitigation) •



Watershed Management Authority

2010 Iowa Legislation authorized the creation of WMAs


- Assess and reduce flood risk
- Assess and improve water quality
- Monitors federal flood risk and planning activities
- Flood and water quality education
- Allocate \$\$ for water quality and flood mitigation



Watershed Management Authority

Middle Cedar WMA

- 1.55 million acres
- Local officials, cities, counties, stakeholders
- Develops partnerships
- Leverage resources for funding and technical expertise
