## What is Hazard Mitigation Action?



- Any sustained action taken to reduce or eliminate the long-term risk to human life and property from hazards
- Action is at the core of the definition.
- How do we sustain action?

## Why We Advance Mitigation Action

- Creates safer communities by reducing loss of life and damage to property and the environment
- Minimizes post-disaster disruption, allowing communities to recover more quickly
- Allows communities to respond and adapt to changing conditions





## Why We Advance Mitigation Action

- Generates secondary economic, environmental, and public health benefits
- Empowers individuals to act as agents of change in their communities
- Lessens financial impacts on individuals, communities, and society as a whole





## **Mitigation Action Tracker**

- A Web-based tool used to capture, store, organize, and track mitigation actions
- Designed to provide:
  - An inventory of actions;
  - A searchable database;
  - Geographic Information System (GIS) capabilities
  - Mitigation ideas; and
  - A resource for tracking actions credited to Risk MAP.



### **Mitigation Action Tracker**

#### National uses

- Documents program progress
- Provides an overview of actions throughout the U.S.
- Creates accountability
  through metrics
- Targets resources



### **Thinking About Actions**

- Action is at the core of community resilience.
- Advancing action is key to the Risk MAP vision.
- Long-lasting mitigation actions do not occur in isolation.



### **Risk MAP Mitigation Measures**

#### Plans and Regulations

Government authorities, policies, or codes that influence the way land and buildings are developed.



#### Natural Systems Protection

#### Actions that minimize damage and losses and also preserve or restore the functions of natural systems.

### **Measuring Success**

- The Risk MAP program must demonstrate success in order to continue its stated goal of risk reduction in the local community.
- To monitor Risk MAP's success, FEMA measures:
  - Increases in awareness of flood risk; and
  - Actions taken to reduce risk.



### **Risk MAP Mitigation Action Measures**

- Action Measure 1 (AM-1)
  - Communities where Risk MAP helped identify or improve mitigation strategies
- Action Measure 2 (AM-2)
  - Communities that have advanced or begun implementing actions
    - Scoped
    - In Progress
    - Completed



### **Criteria for Metrics**

**Eligibility Criteria for Action Metrics** 

- Deployment
  - A community within a Risk MAP project area where resources are being expended to conduct a study.
- Mitigation
  - Actions that directly reduce long-term risk to life and property.
- Risk MAP Delivered
  - A Risk MAP project was used to identify or advance an action.
  - Risk MAP technical assistance was used to identify or advance an action.
  - Risk MAP communication or engagement products were used to identify or advance a mitigation action.
